COVID-19 - Apprentice Safety on Site: Top Ten Checklist - Revised 08/01/2021

The following checklist contains measures that your Employer/Site Management must have in place to ensure they are adequately protecting you and others and minimising the risk of spreading the infection. Many of these measures are already covered under current UK HSE Welfare guidance.

1.	Provide a site induction and daily briefings that includes the additional measures that have been put in place to protect the workforce and minimise the spread of COVID-19 infection.
2.	Provide additional handwashing facilities, ensuring a ready supply of soap, hot water and paper towels or hand sanitiser if hot water and soap are not readily available. Allow additional breaks for handwashing
3.	Ensure that washrooms and toilets are regularly cleaned, soap, sanitiser and paper towels are readily available and that waste paper bins are routinely emptied and safely disposed of.
4.	Restrictions on the number of people able to use toilet at any one time. Where Portable toilets are the only facility available, these must be cleaned and emptied more frequently.
5.	Access to sites should only be allowed for essential visitors only. Ensure social-distancing at the entrance to the site (2 metres between people). Disable finger print scanners to reduce risk of cross contamination. Regularly clean common surfaces in offices, canteens, delivery areas for example: scanners, turnstiles, screens, telephone handsets and desks.
6.	Site Canteen - Staggered break times reducing congestion and allowing social distancing. Hand cleaning or sanitisers at the entrance. Tables should be cleaned between use, vending machines should be cleaned frequently
7.	Changing facilities, Showers and Drying rooms – Staggered use of these facilities, enhanced cleaning and regular disposal of waste.
7.	Close working - When carrying out work activities, workers should adhere to current social distancing requirements.
8.	Government guidance for employers in England states "where the social distancing guidelines cannot be followed in full, in relation to a particular activity, and the activity cannot be redesigned, businesses should consider whether that activity needs to continue for the business to operate, and, if so, take all the mitigating actions possible to reduce the risk of transmission between staff". Employers must carry out suitable and sufficient risk assessment using the Hierarchy of Controls: ELIMINATE, REDUCE, ISOLATE, CONTROL, PPE and BEHAVIOURS and the CLC Site Operating Procedure:

9.	Site Meetings – Only those that have to attend should attend. This should be the bare minimum. Attendees should sit at least 2 meters apart. Meeting rooms should be well ventilated to allow fresh air to circulate. Consider holding meetings in open areas if possible. Thorough cleaning of meeting rooms following use should be completed.
	Cleaning – cleaning activities should be increased to minimise the spread of COVID-19 in communal areas and at touch points including:

	Lift and hoist controls may be used by other workers.

W/hat	t can you do to reduce the spread of COVID-19?
1	Don't go to work if you have any of the symptoms of COVID-19 (High temperature and/or a new persistent cough).
~	Wherever possible travel to work or site alone. If you have to share transport with others they should be shared with the same individuals and with a minimum number of individuals at any one time. Window should be kept open and you should face away from each other.
~	Do wash your hands regularly with soap and hot water or hand sanitiser for a minimum of 20 seconds when you get to work or arrive home, after you blow your nose, cough or sneeze, before you eat or handle food and after you have used the toilet and regularly
1	throughout the day You should cough as spagge into tissues before hinning it responsibly in a waste hin. Wash you immediately afterwards
	You should cough or sneeze into tissues before binning it responsibly in a waste bin. Wash you immediately afterwards. If you feel unwell at work, have a high temperature or a new persistent cough, inform your manager or supervisor, return home, avoid
1	touching anything, cough or sneeze into a tissue or the crook of your elbow. You should <u>get-coronavirus-test</u> and follow <u>stay at home guidance for households with possible or confirmed coronavirus covid-19</u>
~	infection
•	Do not return to site until you have received a negative test result or, in the event of a positive test result, until you have completed your period of self-isolation and are no longer unwell.
1	Follow all arrangements, instructions and guidelines your employer puts in place to minimise the spread of COVID-19 infection If you are concerned about the arrangements your employer or site have put in place to protect you and other workers to protect you
~	from contracting the COVID-19 infection, tell your manager or supervisor immediately. If in doubt contact your CITB Apprenticeship Officer. We should all be working together to reduce the risk of spreading the COVID-19 virus and to protect our co-workers, family and friends and key workers
✓	Use all PPE as instructed and dispose of them responsibly; especially disposable gloves and face masks. Wash your hands immediately to stop any cross-contamination.
